MAGSA Submits Groundwater Sustainability Plan, Begins Implementation

On January 28, 2020, MAGSA and the six other GSAs in the Kings Subbasin submitted their Groundwater Sustainability Plans (GSPs) and Coordination Agreement to the CA Department of Water Resources for review. This action transitions MAGSA from a planning agency to an implementation agency. The GSP outlines a glide path approach to sustainability, allowing landowners room to adjust and continue to thrive over the 20-year implementation period. MAGSA will begin by drafting and adopting board policies in the coming months.

Groundwater Credit Program and Water Market Study Begins

MAGSA awarded engineering firm Geosyntec a contract to study a proactive strategy to bring surface water into the area and a credit system to allocate groundwater resources among landowners with the potential to trade. The study is funded through a \$193,000 Bureau of Reclamation WaterSMART grant, with a \$193,000 cost-share. 
